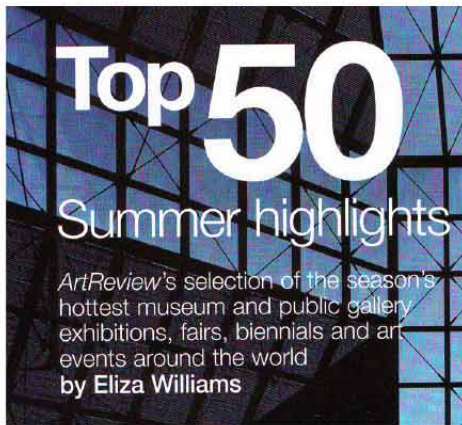

5. Art of Tomorrow
Deutsche Guggenheim, Berlin
13 May-13 August
After showing in New York and Munich,
this touring exhibition arrives in Berlin
for the summer. The show examines the
work of artist Hilla Rebay, the co-founder
and first director and curator of the
Solomon R Guggenheim Museum in New
York. It is also a restaging of the first
landmark exhibition at the museum,
which included works by Kandinsky, Klee
and Nicholson.

6. PhotoEspaña, Madrid
1 June-23 July
Madrid's international festival of
photography and visual arts will this year
explore the theme of nature in a series of
exhibitions, workshops, seminars and
screenings held in venues across the city.

7. Art Basel, 14-18 June
The mother of all art fairs arrives in Basel
for its 37th annual visit this June. Be sure

galleries from Europe, Asia and the USA.

8. Liste 06, Basel, 13-18 June
Now in its 11th year, Liste is firmly
established as the place to check out

9. Volta Show 02, Basel, 14-18 June
Following its hugely successful debut last
year, Volta has doubled in size and will
